SBI PO exam pattern shared below involves Objective as well as Descriptive Exam. We've also updated below SBI PO Syllabus of Mains for all the 4 sections that would be asked in the exam.

1st set of SBI PO exams is almost over (conducted on 29th and 30th April 2017) and the next set will be conducted on 6th and 7th May. Many of you would have started your preparation for SBI PO Mains by now. So, go through the exam pattern and syllabus of SBI PO Mains exam 2017 now.

SBI PO Exam Pattern 2017 for Mains Exam

SBI PO Mains exam will be conducted at 2 levels, namely -

1. Objective Exam
2. Descriptive Exam

- As per official Notification, descriptive papers of only those students would be evaluated, who qualify the objective mains exam.
- Marks obtained in Objective as well as Descriptive tests will be added in the final Merit list along with marks of Group exercise and Interview.

RBI GRADE B

RBI Officer Selection Procedure

Selection Procedure of RBI Grade B Exam (General) comprises of following steps -

1. Preliminary Exam
2. Mains Exam
3. Interview

While the Prelims phase is Objective in nature, Mains phase would comprise of objective as well as descriptive test. You can go through the details of Preliminary and Mains Exams below.

RBI Grade B Syllabus - Phase I & II

Topics asked in Prelims as well as Mains phase of RBI Grade B exam vary to a great extent. Prelims phase consists of the common sections that are asked in exams, i.e., Quant, Reasoning, English and General Awareness. Mains phase on the other hand tests Finance, Management, Economic and Social issues.

RBI Grade B Exam Pattern (Phase I, II)

RBI Grade B Prelims exam would comprise of 4 sections, with a total 2 hours duration. The Mains phase on the other hand would have 3 separate tests, 2 objective and 1 descriptive.

RBI Grade B Syllabus & Exam Pattern 2017 (Phase 1/Phase 2)

The [notification for Grade B Officer 2017](#) has been declared, so we've now updated the details about RBI Grade B Syllabus & exam pattern for Phase 1 & Phase 2 based on the official notification. The RBI Grade B exam pattern for Phase 1/Prelims will be provided along with the information handout which will be available on the official website in some time. The pattern is expected to remain same for Prelims exam as that of last year. The syllabus of [RBI Grade B Officer](#) (General) has also been updated in this post. While preparing for RBI Grade B Exam, you all must know the important areas to focus to clear the exam. Candidates will be shortlisted for the interview, based on aggregate marks obtained in Paper-I, Paper-II and Paper-III of Phase II exam. The interview will carry 50 marks.

Working in RBI provides a new perspective on various banking, economic and cultural dimensions. People working in RBI also get to work with highly experienced and qualified people who've driven the country's economy for many years.

RBI Assistant 2017 Syllabus & Exam Pattern (Prelims & Mains)

RBI Assistant 2017 notification is still awaiting. We will update the detail about RBI Assistant (Prelims & Mains) 2017 exam pattern & syllabus whenever the official notification is out. For RBI Assistant 2016 syllabus & exam pattern you can read the details below-

The notification for the post of [RBI Assistant](#) for 2016 was released recently with 610 vacancies. The pattern of the exam has been changed this year. We are sharing with you all the detailed syllabus and the exam pattern of this exam.

The exam will be conducted in 3 phases unlike previous year where only 2 phases were conducted. The exam will be conducted in the following stages -

1. Preliminary Phase
2. Mains Phase
3. Interview

Before discussing the RBI Assistant Syllabus and Exam Pattern, let's have a look at the following -

- The Online Registration begins from 7.11.2016 and applications would be accepted till 28.11.2016.
- The Tentative dates for the preliminary phase of this exam is 23, 24 December and the mains phase will be conducted in January 2017.

- Educational Qualification - At least a Bachelor's Degree in any discipline with a minimum of 50% marks (pass class for SC/ST/PWD candidates) in the aggregate and the knowledge of word processing on PC. Candidates applying for post in a particular recruiting office should be proficient in the language (i.e. know to read, write, speak and understand the language) of the state/ any of the states falling under the recruiting office.
- Age (as on 07.11.2016) - Between 20 and 28 years.

The Interview will carry 35 marks. There will be negative marks for wrong answers in the Objective tests (Preliminary and Main examination). 1/4th marks will be deducted for each wrong answer.

SBI Clerk 2016

SBI Clerk selection process.

The selection process consists of 3 phases:

- i) Phase – I: Preliminary Examination (Online Objective Test)
- ii) Phase – II: Main Examination (Online Objective Test)
- iii) Phase – III: Interview + Local Language Test (Verbal Test)

Phase-I: Preliminary Examination:

This will be an Online Objective Test consisting of 100 marks and 3 sections, which are distributed as follows:

Note: i) The cutoffs will be applied at two stages i.e. Sectional Cutoff & Overall Cutoff.

ii) There will be a negative marking of 1/4th mark.

Phase – II: Main Examination:

This will be Online Objective Test consisting of 190 questions and is 2 hours 40 minutes. And it will consist of the following tests.

Note: i) The timing for each test is different and is mentioned above.

ii) There will be a negative marking of 1/4th mark.

iii) The cutoffs will be applied at two stages i.e. Sectional Cutoff & Overall Cutoff.

Phase – III: Interview (It will be subjected to government of India approval)

Candidates who qualified in the Main Examination will be arranged in the descending order for each category to prepare a merit list. And those candidates who are well above a prescribed cutoff in the merit will be called for interview.

Note: Interview for this post will occur only if the government of India gives approval.

Besides Interview there will be a **Local/Official Language test**, whose details are given below:

The local /official Language test will be conducted at the time of Interview (if the interview is held). And if Interview is not held, the local Language test will be conducted before the final selection.

Now those candidates who have studied Official /Local Language in the 10th standard will be exempted from Language Test, provided they produce the evidence i.e. mark sheet/certificate.

Candidates who are not proficient in the official and/or local language would be disqualified.

Final Selection:

Phase I will be only qualifying in nature and the marks obtained in Phase I will not be considered for Final Selection.

Final selection will be made on the basis of candidate's performance in Phase II examination and interview (if Interview is held) taken together in order of merit.
