**DAILY VOCABULARY LIST**

❖ **Baulk (verb) (डगमगाना):** Hesitate or be unwilling to accept an idea or undertaking.

**Synonyms:** Hesitate, be unwilling to, draw the line at, draw back from.

**Antonyms:** Accept, meet, face.

**Example:** Monica knew that her husband would **baulk** at going shopping for new clothes, so she told him they were going to see the new action movie.

❖ **Rampage (noun) (उपद्रव):** A period of violent and uncontrollable behavior by a group of people.

**Synonyms:** Berserk, of riotous, Delirium, uproar.

**Antonyms:** Calm, peace, harmony.

**Example:** During the riot, protesters went on a **rampage** and destroyed several buildings in the city.

❖ **Stall (verb) (बाधित करना):** Stop or cause to stop making progress.

**Synonyms:** Halt, Stop, Hinder, Impede, Interrupt, hamstring.

**Antonyms:** Forward, Promote, Assist, Help, aid

**Example:** The engine of a car will **stall** if it runs out of fuel required to keep it running.

❖ **Perforce (adverb) (ज़रूरत पर):** Used to express necessity or inevitability.

**Synonyms:** Necessarily, of necessity, inevitably, unavoidably.

**Antonyms:** Unnecessarily.

**Example:** Because John has been out of work for six months, he is selling his car **perforce**.

❖ **Peeve (noun) (चिढ़):** A cause of annoyance.

**Synonyms:** Annoyance, bother, nuisance, pest, vexation.

**Antonyms:** Delight, joy, pleasure, appeasement.

**Example:** Making a tapping sound on the desk was the **peeve** that annoys a teacher the most.
