DAILY VOCABULARY LIST

❖ **Precarious (adj.) (अस्थिर):** not securely held or in position; dangerously likely to fall or collapse.

Synonyms: Uncertain, Insecure, Unsure, Unpredictable, Risky.

Antonyms: Certain, Secure, Stable.

Example: After losing the job, her financial situation became **precarious**.

❖ **Scrimp (verb) (मितव्यय करना):** be thrifty or parsimonious; economize.

Synonyms: Economize, Skimp, Be (More) Economical, Save, Be Thrifty.

Antonyms: Spend, Waste, Squander.

Example: Because I have a limited amount of money, I am trying to **scrimp** and spend less on food than I usually do.

❖ **Extol (verb) (प्रशंसा करना):** Praise enthusiastically

Synonyms: Applaud, Commend, Eulogize, Idolize, Laud, Acclaim.

Antonyms: Blame, Criticize, Castigate, Censure, Condemn.

Example: I got angry when my mother would **extol** my brother's accomplishments and ignore all the good things I did.

❖ **Pristine (adj.) (अपरिवर्तित):** In its original condition.

Synonyms: Spotless, Uncorrupt, Undebased, Immaculate.

Antonyms: Affected, Dirty, Spoiled.

Example: Because the killer left the murder scene in **pristine** condition, the detectives could not find any clues to his identity.

❖ **Impish (adj.) (हानिकर):** (Of an action or statement) causing or intended to cause harm or trouble.

Synonyms: Malicious, Malevolent, Spiteful, Bitter, Evil-Intentioned, Baleful.

Antonyms: Good, Moral, Behaved, Unmischievous.

Example: The police warned us not to engage in any kind of **impish** behavior on the boardwalk.
