DAILY VOCABULARY LIST

❖ **Hegemony (noun) (आधिपत्य):** Preponderant influence or authority over others.

Synonyms: Authority, Command, Power, Predominance

Antonyms: Subordination, Obedience, play second fiddle to.

Example: When the dictator was chased out of the country, his **hegemony** over the people came to an end.

❖ **Presumably (adv.) (अनुमानत):** Used to convey that what is asserted is very likely though not known for certain.

Synonyms: Apparently, Probably, Supposedly, Presumptively, Assumedly

Antonyms: Certainly, Definitely

Example: Before the generous millionaire died, he **presumably** changed his will and left all of his money to charity.

❖ **Converge (verb) (मिलना):** Tend to meet at a point.

Synonyms: Meet, Come Together, Connect, Link Up, Join, Unite, Merge.

Antonyms: Disperse, Scatter, Differ, Divide, Diverge.

Example: The hospital has made use of the **convergence** of medicine and technology to improve patient care.

❖ **Stewardship (noun) (संचालन):** The job of supervising or taking care of something, such as an organization or property.

Synonyms: Management, Supervision, Governing

Antonyms: Ignorance, Negligence

Example: Under Coach Garry Kirsten's **stewardship**, the team won world cup 2011.

❖ **Passé (adj.) (पुराना):** No longer fashionable; out of date.

Synonyms: Outdated, Old-Fashioned, Outmoded, Outworn, Archaic.

Antonyms: Current, Fashionable, In Vogue, Modern, New.

Example: Once a new social media site becomes trendy, all of the old sites become **passé** and lose users.
