DAILY VOCABULARY LIST

❖ **Hapless (adj.) (अभागा):** Especially of a person unfortunate.

Synonyms: Unfortunate, Unlucky, Luckless, Out Of Luck, Ill-Starred, Ill-Fated.

Antonyms: Fortuitous, Fortunate, Lucky, Well-Off.

Example: When Jason lost his wife and job on the same day, he knew he was a **hapless** soul.

❖ **Hound (verb) (तंग करना):** Harass, persecute, or pursue relentlessly.

Synonyms: Harass, Persecute, Harry, Pester, Trouble, Badger, Torment.

Antonyms: Delight, Make Happy, Please, Protect, Comfort.

Example: The gang members have been known to **hound** people who threaten to report them to the police.

❖ **Eloquent (adj.) (भावपूर्ण):** fluent or persuasive in speaking or writing.

Synonyms: Articulate, Fecund, Expressive, Fluent.

Antonyms: Dull, Inarticulate.

Example: When you listen to the **eloquent** person's speech, you always understand his message.

❖ **Vie (verb) (स्पर्धा करना):** Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something.

Synonyms: Compete, Contend, Contest, Strive, Be Rivals For.

Antonyms: Avoid, Eschew From.

Example: Four teams **vied** in annual function of Company, of which Team GI Joe was declared victorious.

❖ **Coy (adj.) (शर्मीला):** Making a pretence of shyness or modesty which is intended to be alluring.

Synonyms: Shy, Bashful, Self-Effacing, Demure.

Antonyms: Aggressive, Forward, Immodest, Impudent, Unshy.

Example: Because Mia wanted Greg to think she was an innocent young woman, she acted **coy** around him.
