DAILY VOCABULARY LIST

❖ **Vitriol (noun) (कटु शब्द):** Bitter criticism or malice.

Synonyms: Malevolence, Disdain, Nastiness, Hatred.

Antonyms: Admiration, Love, Respect.

Example: World War II was one of the most **vitriolic** wars of all time, killing over 50 million worldwide.

❖ **Prevail (verb) (प्रबल):** To be or prove superior in strength, power, or influence.

Synonyms: Vanquish, Conquer, Surmount, Triumph

Antonyms: Fail, Forfeit, Lose, Surrender

Example: Which of these two laws will **prevail**, God only knows.

❖ **Abjure (verb) (छोड़ना):** Solemnly renounce (a belief, cause, or claim).

Synonyms: Renounce, Relinquish, Disavow, Disclaim, Forswear.

Antonyms: Assert, Avow, Claim

Example: As part of his religious faith, John **abjured** meat and now only eats vegetables and fruits.

❖ **Disposed (adj.) (झुका हुआ):** Having a specified attitude to or towards.

Synonyms: Biased, Inclined, Prone, Apt

Antonyms: Averse, Reluctant, Unwilling

Example: He is favourably **disposed** towards the proposals.

❖ **Exhort (verb) (प्रेरित करना):** Strongly encourage or urge (someone) to do Something.

Synonyms: Urge, Encourage, Goad, Spur, Egg On, Persuade, Propel,

Antonyms: Deter, Discourage, Dissuade,

Example: A good leader will **exhort** people to achieve their own forms of greatness rather than try to force them on a certain path.
