**DAILY VOCABULARY LIST**

❖ **Labyrinthine (adj.) (जटिल):** Intricate and complex.

**Synonyms:** Convoluted Intricate, Serpentine, Tortuous, Twisting,

**Antonyms:** Easy, Simple, Straightforward, Direct.

**Example:** The casino was designed as a **labyrinth** to keep gamblers trapped inside.

❖ **Redress (verb) (सुधारना):** Remedy or set right (an undesirable or unfair situation).

**Synonyms:** Rectify, Correct, Right, Reform, Amend.

**Antonyms:** Damage, Make Worse, aggravate.

**Example:** The manager gave me a free meal as **redress** for the awful service I received in his restaurant.

❖ **Extraneous (adj.) (असंगत):** Irrelevant or unrelated to the subject being dealt with.

**Synonyms:** Irrelevant, Immaterial, Unrelated, Unconnected, Inapposite.

**Antonyms:** Relevant, Appropriate, Basic, Integral

**Example:** One should always check his credit card bills for **extraneous** charges.

❖ **Ravage (noun) (बरबाद कर देना):** Cause severe and extensive damage to.

**Synonyms:** Devastate, Ruin, Destroy, Wreak Havoc On, Demolish.

**Antonyms:** Preserve, Protect, Save, Guard.

**Example:** If diabetes is not controlled, it can **ravage** many organs in the human body.

❖ **Malignant (adj.) (नुकसानदेह):** Evil in nature or effect; malevolent.

**Synonyms:** Spiteful, Malevolent, Malicious, Malign, Evil-Intentioned, Baleful.

**Antonyms:** Harmless, Helpful, Invigorating, Benign.

**Example:** When the doctors discovered a **malignant** disease in Sam's body, they told him he only had six months to live.
